Video & Audio Documentation

Recording practices, interviews, songs, and techniques through video or audio helps preserve knowledge in a format that can be revisited and shared. These tools are especially useful when skills are embodied or transmitted orally.

Social Media & Online Platforms

Social media and websites increase visibility and allow heritage to reach wider audiences. They create spaces for interaction, dialogue, and participation, particularly for younger generations.

Digital Storytelling

Digital storytelling combines images, text, and voice to narrate the meaning behind practices and traditions. It allows communities to tell their own stories in accessible and engaging formats.

Digital Archives & Interactive Tools

Digital archives, maps, and QR codes organise and connect heritage elements in structured ways. They make knowledge searchable, accessible, and easier to navigate across time and place.
